Who are we?

Roots of Empathy is an internationally acclaimed, award winning, children's charity, founded in 1996 by award-winning social entrepreneur, educator and author, Mary Gordon. There are two elements to Roots of Empathy, our empathy-based children's programs that have reached over 1.2 million children and our empathy movement. The organization and its Founder have received prestigious international and national awards for innovation including HundrED, a global education not for profit based in Finland. Roots of Empathy has won the distinction of being one of the top 100 Education Innovations every year since HundrED started giving the awards. Roots of Empathy has been given the Hall of Fame Distinction and in 2025 was awarded one of a small of group education programs, the world's top ratings for providing wellbeing programs in schools. Roots of Empathy and our Founder have been cited in more than 1,200 scholarly articles/books in more than 60 countries around the world and we regularly contribute to the global discussion of empathy.

The Roots of Empathy Program is an evidence-based program delivered in elementary schools and is evidence-based to reduce aggression, including bullying, and to increase prosocial behaviours (caring, sharing, helping including and kindness) and empathy. The program's success has been proven by over 2 decades of independent research.

Roots of Empathy first came to the United States in 2007 and Seattle was our first US implementation.

Key Responsibilities Seattle, Program Coordinator:

- Secures training locations and coordinate logistics of training, including dates, meals and refreshments, audiovisual equipment and number of participants, in collaboration with the International Liaison
- Oversee the Roots of Empathy programs throughout the Greater Seattle Area
- Monitor progress and provide updates on the status of programs
- Make presentations to raise and maintain the awareness of the program
- Work with the International Liaison to promote public awareness of the program at community events and respond to media and VIP requests
- Maintain police clearance for Instructors
- Deepen relationships and explore opportunities to work collaboratively with communities across the Greater Seattle Area, organizations and agencies in Seattle to: (i) broaden mutual awareness and understanding; (ii) explore opportunities for programs growth and (iii) interest in funding partnerships to sustain programs
